PLAN AHEAD

SET THE ENVIRONMENT UP FOR SUCCESS. ONLY INCLUDE ITEMS

THAT ARE SAFE FOR KIDS TO TOUCH & PLAY WITH.





CREATE A NATURAL BARRIER

SET UP VEHICLES, TABLES, AND ACTIVITIES AROUND THE PERIMETER CREATING A NATURAL BARRIER AND REDUCING THE RISK OF ELOPEMENT.

SENSORY SAFE

LIGHTS & SIRENS CAN INCREASE STRESS AND RISK OF SEIZURE.

WHEN CREATING A SENSORY SAFE ENVIRONMENT, DON'T
FORGET TO TURN DOWN OR MUTE OTHER ALARMS & WALKIES.





HUDDLE-UP

BEFORE THE EVENT BEGINS HAVE A MEETING WITH YOUR TEAM
TO HELP CLARIFY THE EXPECTATIONS AND GIVE MEMBERS AN
IDEA OF WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN WORKING WITH SPECIAL
NEEDS FAMILIES.

CREATE A BREAK SPACE

DESIGNATE AN AREA AWAY FROM LOUD NOISES & CROWDS
WHERE INDIVIDUALS CAN TAKE A BREAK IF NEEDED.





USE VISUALS

Use visuals such as stop signs to identify areas that may be off limits. Other visuals highlighting where to wait, where to take a break, & different activity areas can be helpful.

SUSPEND JUDGMENT & COMMENTS

SENSORY FRIENDLY EVENTS ALLOW FOR FAMILIES TO INTERACT IN A JUDGMENT FREE ZONE CREATING A SAFE SPACE FOR SPECIAL NEEDS FAMILIES.





TAKE THE PARENTS LEAD

MELTDOWNS HAPPEN! IF A KIDDO HAS A HARD TIME CHECK IN WITH THE PARENT OR CAREGIVER HOW YOU CAN BE HELPFUL.
